Kierkegaard, a Dane, 1813-1855, was considered by many to be the first existentialist. Experience was central to him in the spiritual journey to inward transformation. After some youthful wild dissipation he turned to religion and the spiritual way. Soren believed in the individual encounter with God. Opposite to the modern science that focuses on the visible, Soren chose to focus on the invisible, that which is within us. Christendom, for him, was too much about doctrine and behavior, rather than about the interior struggle for a relationship with Christ. He believed that Christianity is not so much a doctrine to be taught, as a life to be lived. The malady of our his age was Mediocrity.
