Has Christianity been losing its place in the modern technological culture? Simone Weil, W.H. Auden, C.S. Lewis, T.S. Eliot and Jacques Maritain tried to keep Christianity in the mix, before and after WWII. Along came Jacques Ellul to keep at the task of the importance of religion and more specifically contemplation to counter all the worst of the technological power structure. This Frenchman who died in 1994 saw that modern revolutions lacked a spiritual consciousness that only deep prayer could awaken. The modern age lacked a sufficient direct encounter with God, and thus lacked direct encounters of love with one another. Contemplation must lead to selfless love. In the technological modern world people have become a means to an end. Is there hope? Ellul thinks so.
